Become a volunteer - in Germany

Would you like to get to know Germany and make new experiences? Social commitment and ecological matters are important to you? Then become a 'weltwärts' volunteer, with ADRAlive!

Every year we welcome young people from abroad for a year to get involved in various charitable projects. Perhaps you would like to be the next one?

We can testify from our own experience that travelling is life-changing: Not only do you get to know new people, cultures, values and places, but you also experience them for a year. They become a part of your life story.

Together with our partners we accompany and support you in terms of educational, financial, administrative and organizational matters - before, during and after your voluntary service. We look at topics such as global and social inequalities, cultural differences, sustainability and development together from completely new perspectives.

Your voluntary service is largely funded by the BMZ (German Federal Ministry for Economic Cooperation and Development). This means that there are no costs for you, as most of the funding and costs are covered by the BMZ.

Requirements for Volunteering in Germany

- You are between 18 and 28 years of age, or 35 if you have an impairment or disability.
- You are in good enough health to complete a volunteering assignment abroad. An impairment or disability does not rule out health suitability.
- You have a school-leaving qualification, a vocational qualification or equivalent work experience.
- Your country of residence appears on the DAC list of the OECD.



- You are a team player, open-minded, willing to learn, proactive and have a respectful attitude towards new things.
- You are enthusiastic about social engagement and ecological commitment.

Duration of the volunteer service with ADRAlive!

An ADRAlive! assignment usually lasts around 12 months, starting in August and ending in July of the following year.

Possible areas of assignment in our program include:

- Children's homes/ day care centres
- Kindergarten
- Schools
- Community work, social work
- Agriculture, environmental protection and animal welfare
- Work with refugees

Funding and costs

The weltwärts programm covers all essential costs for the volunteers. ADRA does not charge any placement fees or expense allowances for the volunteer service, but as the sending organisation it bears at least 25% of the costs incurred. With the support of weltwärts funding, the volunteers receive from ADRA or the partner organisation:

- Adequate, locally customary board and lodging in the host country (or payment of a monthly board and lodging allowance)
- Reimbursement of travel expenses in the host country
- Insurance (liability, health and accident insurance)
- Seminars before, during and after the service
- Reimbursement of costs for visa applications
- Reimbursement of costs for vaccinations and preventive and follow-up health care
- Educational support throughout the year
- Budget for a language course



Your application

Apply now for the 2025/26 placement year!

Selection criteria and personal requirements

ADRA decides on participation in the volunteer program in a selection process.

Selection criteria and requirements include:

- 18 - 28 years of age at the time of departure
- Completed education (school and/or vocational training)
- Advantageous: Experience in working with children and/or youth work, or ecological projects, farming, sustainability-related work, etc.
- Good health, physical resilience and mental stability
- Desired: Language skills (English/ possibly German), or willingness to learn it

Everything we need from you

We would be delighted if you decide to apply for an assignment abroad with ADRA.

- 2x completed application form
- Letter of motivation in English
- CV in English (in tabular form)
- Your last two school reports/exams
- If available, any internship certificates from the social sector
- Letter of recommendation from a teacher, pastor, church leader or head of department of a non-profit organisation where you volunteer (no family members!)

Dates

Approximate timetable - secondment 2025/2026:

Timeline for the Application Process - weltwärts South-North Program

October 2025:

- **Start of Application Submissions**
The application process begins, and initial applications are received.

Mid/End of October 2025:



- **Feedback and Initial Interviews**

Applicants will receive feedback on their application status, and the first interviews will be conducted.

Mid/End of November 2025:

- **Selection Seminar and Visa Applications**

Shortlisted candidates will participate in the selection seminar, and visa applications will be processed.

Mid-July 2026:

- **Preparation Seminar in the Home Country**

Selected Volunteers will attend a preparation seminar in their home country.

End of July 2026:

- **Arrival in Germany**

Volunteers will travel to Germany for the start of their voluntary service.

August 2026:

- **Continuation of Preparation Seminar in Germany**

Volunteers will continue the preparation seminar upon their arrival in Germany.

FAQ – frequently asked questions

- **Is it difficult to get a visa?**

That depends on the country of origin. The visa process in Tanzania and Mozambique, for example, can be complicated and takes time. However, we will assist you with this process, your application, and generally in advance and during your voluntary service year.

- **Can I do voluntary service at the age of 17?**

Unfortunately, you cannot do voluntary service abroad at the age of 17. However, you can apply at 17, as long as you will be 18 years old when you leave your home country (by July 2025).

- **Do I need to know the local language beforehand?**



Language skills in German are an advantage, but not a prerequisite for your application. However, it is important that you are willing to learn the language and attend a language course. Doing first steps to learn the language before you leave the country is something we would recommend and like to see. We will also support you financially with a language course in Germany.

However, English skills are necessarily required.

- **Do I need to have experience in the field of work of my chosen project?**

No. Previous experience in the various areas of work is an advantage but is not a prerequisite for an assignment.

Costs, benefits and insurance cover

- **What will the voluntary service cost me?**

All essential costs for visa, accommodation, meals, travel, language course and insurance in Germany are covered.

How to apply

- **How can I apply?**

To apply, we need various documents from you, such as your CV and letter of motivation. You can find out more information on all required documents here.

- **Until when can I apply?**

As long as we still have places available, you can still apply. However, it is generally an advantage if you apply by October, as the visa process can take a long time and effort. Also, we are planning to allocate most of the places by November. So, if you apply late, your chances of getting placed might decrease.

- **I have an illness/impairment. Can I still apply?**

That depends on the individual case and, above all, the project you want to work in. Just send us an email if you're not sure. We will be happy to look for a suitable solution with you.



Commitment on site

- **Will I be the only volunteer in the project?**

No, usually not. We always try to place two volunteers in a project together. In rare cases and after consultation with the volunteer, volunteers are also placed on site alone. However, there will always be a permanent contact person in your project, to guide you and be available for you on site.

- **Who is my contact person?**

Here in Germany, our ADRAlive! team with many years of work experience will be there for you. We will support you during the preparation phase, during your voluntary service and, together with our partner organization from your home country, even after your return.

During your year in Germany, you will also be guided by a permanent contact person in your project. In addition, a mentor will be available to assist you regarding various questions, if needed.

- **Will I be accommodated in a host family?**

This is one possible constellation of accommodation, especially when your project is in a rural area. Another option could be to live in your own flat with other volunteers, if available.

- **Do I have to organise my own accommodation?**

No, we will organise your accommodation. We will make sure that your accommodation is safe and furnished according to local standards.

- **What does my everyday life look like?**

That depends entirely on your project, which skills you bring along, or in which area you would like to contribute. Your workload is a maximum of 40 hours per week. In most projects, however, it is less. You are free to organise your free time as you wish.

- **Do I have holiday entitlement?**

Yes, you are entitled to 2 days' holiday per month of assignment. You can also take these in one go. Public holidays in the country of posting are not deducted from this. However,



you may only take holiday after three months so that you arrive at the assignment location properly.

Information on possible places of assignment:

Happy Kids e.V.

Happy Kids"e.V. is registered as a deployment site for international volunteers in the “weltwärts” program, dedicated to the fields of integration, child and youth welfare and education, as well as environmental protection, nature conservation and sustainability.

Happy Kids e.V. is a non-profit and charitable association that supports children and young people with life-limiting, chronic illnesses, psychological neglect or traumatising. In their family-run ‘children's animal oasis’ on an idyllic farm in Klein-Bieberau (located approx. 20km from the city of Darmstadt), Happy Kids offers affected children and their families a welcome break from their clinic routine, an experience of release and unforgettable moments with tame animals from animal-protection programs. In addition, a wildlife centre for hedgehogs, foxes and other animals in need is being built up and established soon. The ‘Children's Animal Oasis’ is not only a place of recreation, but also a place of learning, that teaches topics such as climate protection and sustainability. Also, a ‘farm classroom’ learning centre for the future is currently in the phase of planning and conception.

Possible tasks of volunteers include:

- Care, feeding, grooming and training of our animals
- Looking after the families and groups
- Assisting with the development and maintenance of our grounds and the ‘Children's Animal Oasis’
- Support in the maintenance of materials
- Assistance with marketing and social media activities
- Contribution to administrative tasks

What Happy Kids offers to volunteers:

- A warm environment with a family connection
- Free accommodation and regular daily meals in a family household (4 people during the week, 7 people at the weekend)
- A meaningful job in an intergenerational household



- Specialized guidance and availability for your questions and needs

Haus Odenwald

Haus Odenwald is a residential home for people with disabilities, providing a place to live for 25 people with predominantly mental or multiple disabilities.

It is an integration support center run by the Seventh-day Adventist Church.

25 people live in Haus Odenwald, a special form of accommodation. The multidisciplinary team of educational and domestic staff support the residents with a wide range of tasks.

Accompanying residents to medical appointments, organising leisure activities, catering and laundry are just some of the many tasks undertaken by the team.

There are 22 single rooms and 3 double rooms. There are two lounges, 3 kitchens, a workshop and a relaxation room.

Around 30 staff are responsible for care and support. The centre is open 24 hours a day, all year round.

- Leisure time supervision
- Accompaniment to public offices, doctors, shopping etc.
- Assistance with daily and personal matters
- Assistance with daily routines (including housekeeping, delivering meals, etc.)
- Possible assistance with personal care and hygiene (if residents agree)
- Household activities (technology, cleaning, food preparation, laundry, gardening, etc.)
- Administrative support as required
